Army Flying Museum

Discover the fascinating story of British Army Flying, charting over 100 years of the British Army in the air. Over 35 fixed-wing and rotary aircraft are on display.

Danebury Hill IRON AGE FORT

Built 2,500 years ago and occupied for 500 years, all that remains is a ring marking where it once stood. Enjoy great walks with panoramic views.



Stockbridge

The River Test flows alongside the main street of this attractive Hampshire town, lined with a selection of local shops, art and craft galleries, tearooms and cafés. Come on 3 August and enjoy the town's Trout 'n About food festival.

Houghton Lodge Gardens

In an idyllic setting with views across the valley, these glorious formal and informal gardens and lawns sweep down to the River Test.

There's a traditional kitchen garden enclosed by chalk cob walls and a 350 feet long herbaceous border, colourful all through the seasons.

Enjoy freshly prepared light lunches, cream teas and homemade cakes in the Honesty tearooms.



Mottisfont NATIONAL TRUST

Ancient trees and rolling lawns frame this intriguing 18th-century house with a medieval priory at its heart. Make sure you see the extraordinary drawing-room painted by Rex Whistler.

The beautiful gardens are a feast for the senses all year round, where winding paths meander through stately trees, all with the sound of water never far away. There's a wild play area for kids, a shop and places to eat.

It's just a 10 minute walk from the bus stop on the main road.

Romsey

The magnificent Norman abbey dominates the town with medieval streets clustered around it. The abbey can trace its origins back to AD 907.

Look out for the medieval King John's House, Tudor Cottage and former Victorian gun shop which now form a new heritage centre and tearoom with a series of period gardens leading down to a bubbling mill stream.

At the busy Farmers' Market, held on the first Sunday of the month, you can buy top quality products grown or made in the area.
